JOB PURPOSE:

To provide structured, longer-term therapeutic interventions to children, young people, and carers following a period of crisis or disruption. Working as part of a multi-disciplinary, trauma-informed team, the post holder will deliver evidence-based direct work to promote emotional recovery, relational repair, and long-term placement stability.

The post holder will contribute to a psychologically informed environment that supports recovery from trauma, builds resilience, and strengthens the capacity of carers to meet the complex needs of adolescents at risk of exploitation, placement breakdown, or care entry.

PRINCIPAL RESPONSIBILITIES AND ACTIVITIES:

- Deliver structured, trauma-informed therapeutic sessions to children and young people aged 10+, including those looked after or on the edge of care.
- Support emotional regulation, attachment, and resilience through developmentally informed and relational approaches.
- Provide ongoing therapeutic support to carers and families, helping them understand and respond to trauma-related behaviours using consistent, nurturing strategies.
- Use a range of evidence-based techniques tailored to individual need, such as cognitive behavioural approaches, Dyadic Developmental Psychotherapy (DDP), and creative or play-based interventions.
- Where appropriate, deliver joint sessions with carers and young people to strengthen relationships, trust, and communication.
- Work in partnership with Clinical Psychologists, attending consultations and contributing to psychological formulations and intervention plans.
- Participate in multi-agency meetings to ensure coordinated support and seamless transitions across service tiers.

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- Maintain clear, outcome-focused records and contribute to evaluations and reviews of intervention progress.
- Attend regular supervision, reflective practice sessions, and team meetings to support continuous improvement and practitioner resilience.
- Contribute to the wider development of trauma-informed practice within the Edge of Care service.
